THE GIFT OF MEMORIES

When you put the holidays and children together, what do you get? Memories. Children have an amazing ability to record themselves in our hearts. We do everything in our power to remember everything they do and say. From day one, we create scrapbooks, baby books, take pictures, and even keep clippings of their hair, just so our memories of their precious years will not fade from our minds. Children also have a way of inquiring about our memories. They look at our memories of them as a sign of love for them. So, they often ask us to recall those memories. "Dad, tell me about the time when I walked for the first time." "Mom, tell me again what my first words were."

In fact, if we really think back to all that the Lord has done for us, we would only be left amazed at just how amazing He is. Psalm 40:5 says, "Many, O LORD my God, are the wonders you have done. The things you planned for us no one can recount to you; were I to speak and tell of them, they would be too many to declare." Our memories are a gift given to us by God to help us trust Him and love Him more and more each day. They are even helpful for those times when we begin to forget just how much He does mean to us, and get pulled away by the distractions of a busy world. John tells the Christians in Ephesus who had begun to get complacent and neglectful of their service to God, "You have forsaken your first love. Remember the height from which you have fallen." (Revelation 2:4-5) I am sure when they thought back to when they first gave their life to Jesus Christ and fell in love with His great sacrifice for their sins, those memories inspired them to once again offer their "bodies as living sacrifices" to God. (Romans 12:1)

Memories are gifts from God that are waiting to be opened. So, when you are looking at the old photos, reading through the journals, and talking about old times, don't forget to remember the things that our LORD has done for you. Even longer lasting than any photo or keepsake, is the eternal life that we have through our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.
