THE MOST WONDERFUL TIME OF THE YEAR

"It's the most wonderful time of the year." Those are the words that I heard Andy Williams singing on the radio the other day. For some, there are many reasons to believe that those words are true this time of year (presents, pretty lights, good food, caroling, time with loved ones, etc.). However, for others, it definitely does not feel like "the most wonderful time of the year." For some, the gathering of family and friends during this time of year can resurrect old wounds. Loved ones who have passed away come to mind, and old painful memories of families torn apart by divorce or tragedy resurface. There are people who are hurting this time of year. Often, as we hurry through the holiday rush, we become so focused on ourselves that we sometimes become blind to those hurting around us.

In Psalm 147:3, the Psalmist describes God in these words: "He heals the brokenhearted and binds up their wounds." That is such a wonderful picture of God. Throughout the Bible, it is comforting to see that God has always been concerned with the hurting. Jesus reflected that concern during His earthly ministry, even when He was involved in something else. When Jesus was on His way to heal the daughter of Jairus (a very important man), He was not too busy to stop and help a woman who was ill. The woman had fought her way through the crowd just to touch Jesus' cloak in hopes of being healed of her illness, and she was. After healing the woman, Jesus said to her in Mark 5:34, "Your faith has healed you. Go in peace and be freed from your suffering." Jesus had something important to do and time was of the essence. Yet, He was still willing to stop in the middle of His task to change a woman's life. As Christians who are told by Jesus to let our light shine (Matthew 5:16), do we not have the same responsibility to stop and help those in need?

Hurting people are in every one of our lives, and within our church. They might not fight their way through the crowd of people to let us know, but shouldn't we be looking for them? This holiday season, when you are buying gifts, you might think of a friend whose holiday is not a pleasant one, and may want to buy that person a special gift. When you are planning your holiday meal, you may want to invite someone to dinner who will be alone this year. When you are making your holiday visits, calls, or writing your cards, you may want to include a few lonely individuals to remind them there are still people who care.

As God's people, it is our calling to show compassion to the hurting, the less fortunate, and the sick. Jesus tells us that one day we will stand before our Judge and Creator, and the saved will hear, "Come, you who are blessed by my Father, take your inheritance, the kingdom prepared for you since the creation of the world. For I was hungry and you gave me something to eat, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you invited me in, I needed clothes and you clothed me, I was sick and you looked after me, I was in prison and you came to visit me." (Matthew 25:34-36) Our rushed holiday pace should never distract us from our mission to let the love of Jesus shine. This could be "the most wonderful time of the year" to share Jesus with someone.
