SIMPLE BIRTH, MIGHTY RETURN

A Hebrew peasant woman, named Mary, was going to have a baby. A carpenter, named Joseph, was the baby's father. There was no room at the inn, and so, the baby would be born in a manger where animals are kept. WAIT A MINUTE! This does not sound like the birth of a great and mighty king or a savior, a messiah. After all, Isaiah prophesied in Isaiah 9:6-7, "For to us a child is born... He will be called Wonderful Counselor, Mighty God, Everlasting Father, Prince of Peace... He will reign on David's throne and over his kingdom." This baby should have been born in a beautiful castle, amongst kings, people bowing, and people celebrating everywhere. But instead, there was no one around but Mary, Joseph, and some animals in a manger. The greatest human being to ever walk the earth was born and it seemed that no one cared.

This prophesied king and savior was born without earthly privileges, royalty, or power. He was as human as one can be... and... that's the point. He had to be fully human to do what He came to do. Hebrews 2:14 says, "Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might destroy him who holds the power of death-that is, the devil." Later in v17-18, the Hebrew author says, "... he had to be made like his brothers in every way, in order that he might become a merciful and faithful high priest in service to God, and that he might make atonement for the sins of the people. Because he himself suffered when he was tempted, he is able to help those who are being tempted."

Our Lord understands how difficult life is because He lived a life on earth. He understands our pain. And so, we draw strength and comfort knowing that our Lord knows our struggles. And then there is the part where we can draw our hope. Not only was our Lord human, born from a woman, but He went on to live without sin. Thus, He became the perfect sacrifice for man's sin. Not only that, but He went on to conquer death in His resurrection from the dead. Jesus became flesh to bring us hope. It is a hope that is made available to everyone.

John 1:14 tells us, "The word became flesh and dwelt among us." God was born into this world, not to reign over an earthly kingdom, but rather, to reign over all in an eternal kingdom. He was born into this world to deal with the issue of our sin, so that we may become citizens of His eternal kingdom. That's what the angel told Joseph when he announced the birth of Jesus in Matthew 1:21, saying about Mary, "She will give birth to a son, and you are to give him the name Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins."

Without the plan that God had set in motion from the very beginning; without the plan that all of the patriarchs, prophets, and poets talked about from long ago;

without the birth of Jesus; without the death, burial, resurrection of Jesus... we would not have hope for eternal salvation; we would not be saved from sin.

Our sin demands our death or the death of a sinless substitute, and that is ultimately what the birth of Jesus is all about. 2 Corinthians 5:21 says, "God made him who had no sin to be sin for us, so that in him we might become the righteousness of God." Jesus came the first time to save the world from sin. Jesus will come the second time to bring His faithful home. The second coming is going to be different from the first. The first time, few people saw Him. At His return, everyone will see Him. The first time He would be called Jesus. At His return, He will be called King of Kings, Lord of Lords; and every knee will bow before the Eternal King. Share the story!
